We know that this service will be a significant benefit to the people of Axminster and the surrounding villages and will relieve some of the bed pressures within the Royal Devon Trust.

Axminster Hospital

Whilst our main focus has been on the implementation of the end of life service, our core constitutional drives remain, to ensure that the medical health and wellbeing of the people of Axminster is supported wherever necessary. We will continue to support new equipment and services at the hospital. This drive has enabled the clinics and surgeries at Axminster Hospital to thrive and grow with our Ophthalmology unit being a centre of excellence.

Focus on Ophthalmology

Ophthalmology Services at Axminster Hospital are committed to sustaining and developing provision to ensure that patients in the local community and surrounding areas can access local ophthalmic care. Recently they have implemented a direct referral pathway from opticians and GP services for Axminster hospital patients. They have increased theatre utilisation and reduced waiting times to approximately 12 weeks. They are offering bilateral cataract surgery to avoid additional visits and reduce patients waiting times. The department has implemented face to face pre-op at initial consultation onsite, where patients are able to receive an operation date that day if they choose to. There are plans in place to use the treatment room for minor oculoplastic surgery when the specialist nurse has completed the training. This will increase capacity at Axminster and reduce oculoplastic waiting list times. The outpatient area is being reorganised to create new diagnostic lanes to facilitate the use of additional equipment including the Clarus 500 which provides Ultra -Wide field retinal photography. This will help reduce outpatient waiting times and improve efficiency.


